Friends of Kids with Cancer is devoted to enriching the daily lives of children undergoing treatment for, and survivors of, cancer and blood-related diseases. Our mission is to be an advocate for these special kids and provide them and their families with the Educational, Emotional and Recreational support needed as a result of the long hours of chemotherapy, illness and isolation.



#### WHEN LAUGHTER WAS AN UNCOMMON EVENT ...

Pediatric oncology used to be a lonely field - lonely for the patients and families who were often in isolation rooms during long, repeated stays in the hospital, lonely for the medical providers because colleagues could never imagine why anyone would choose pediatric oncology as a profession. Lonely because smiles were often hard to come by.

The field has certainly improved. Cure rates that were just over 50% in the early 90's are now nearly Unfortunately, as a 85%. profession, meeting the "other" non-medical needs of children battling cancer - and their families - has lagged far behind.

A little over 25 years ago, Friends of Kids with Cancer formed. Initially, the thought was to provide "a little extra entertainment in the waiting room." There we were, so proud of the fact that we had a VCR library with 18 tapes! But over the years, we learned that educational, emotional, and

recreational assistance are just as important in a child's journey as the medicines they receive.

The impact of Friends is now far beyond what any of us imagined. We provide tutoring in the office, art therapy, real food, programs to integrate children back into school, toys that are REAL toys. And we understand that families have needs, that siblings require special attention, and most important, that our kids should not have their childhood stolen by an unfair disease... this is the spirit of the Friends mission.

We have come to accept everything that Friends provides as necessary, obvious, even normal – but it is truly a "new normal" that is not matched anywhere. When I meet with my colleagues in other cities and states, they are literally amazed (and more than a little jealous) of the services that Friends provides. I hear repeatedly, "Nothing like this exists anywhere ... "We are privileged to have many patients that have been - Dr. Robert Bergamini, Mercy St. Louis



cured of their disease. But the greater comes with satisfaction the realization that so many of our kids have not just survived cancer, they have conquered it. They have smiles on their faces. They have succeeded despite what cancer threw their way. They look toward the future with hope. These things would not be possible without the support of Friends!

And you know what? Laughter is now an everyday occurrence.

Hats on Day is a great and easy way for schools, businesses and places of worship to create countless smiles and help kids with cancer... be kids!

Since its founding in 1995, Hats on Day has quickly become more than just a year-round fundraiser. For many this program fight symbolizes the and struggle of loved ones battling cancer and empowers the school/community to rally together with shared support during the child's hardest time.

Side effects associated with chemotherapy and treatment regularly include fatigue, missed days of school, and hair loss. Hats provide the young patient with a "protective shield" safeguarding them from lingering stares and murmurs. In some cases, the child may also experience a feeling of isolation as they are often the only ones allowed to wear a hat while in class. With this in mind, Hats on Day was created so everyone can wear a hat and provide a welcoming and supportive environment for these special kids.

We provide everything you need: Hats On Day stickers, a guide with fun ideas and posters to put up, and informational brochures. Schools, businesses, and churches can participate by paying a dollar to wear a hat. Just pick a date, collect the money that day, and have fun!


