

Our Emotional Programs instill confidence in our patients and help form therapeutic relationships, which assist in releasing built-up emotions.







A "NO JUDGEMENT ZONE" - SUPPORT GROUP BRINGS LIGHT TO A DARK TIME

If it takes a village to raise a child, it takes a village plus a team to raise a child with cancer. The team is made up of professionals, doctors, nurses, social workers, counselors, your family (parents, siblings, relatives) and friends who will become family. They will, at times, think they are professionals and know what you need better than you do. That's OK, just let them.

Your support system will be made up of those who are going through, or already have gone through what you are going through now.

- ★ They will teach, advise, suggest and, most importantly, care.
- ★ They will let you know you are OK when that is the last thing you feel like.
- ★ They will teach you that everything you are feeling and thinking is normal.
- ★ They will get you to smile and laugh even though you don't think you have anything to smile or laugh about.
- ★ They will let you know it's OK to smile and laugh and even cry all at the same time.
- ★ They will understand when no one else has understood that day, that week or since diagnosis.

This part of your team is your support system and can be found in the support groups of Friends of Kids with Cancer.



Music therapy is important...

Music Therapy is the clinical and evidence-based use of music interventions to accomplish individualized goals within a therapeutic relationship by a credentialed professional who has completed an approved music therapy program.

It has been shown to be an efficacious and valid treatment option for medical patients with a variety of diagnoses which is why we were so eager to fund this program for our special kiddos AND their siblings.

Research results and clinical experiences attest to the viability of music therapy even

in those patients resistant to other treatment approaches. Music is a form of sensory stimulation, which provokes responses due to the familiarity, predictability, and feelings of security associated with it.

"Music can heal and bring hope to a child. And sometimes it feels like one song can change your whole life. Music is a language which connects us all." said Friends of Kids with Cancer's new music therapist **Christy Merrell, MT-BC**

Through a planned and systematic use of music and music activities, Christy provides a wide range of opportunities for our kiddos including:

- Anxiety and stress reduction
- Nonpharmacological management of cronic pain and discomfort
- Positive changes in mood and emotional states, thereby improving communication and enhancing memory
- ☐ Promotes positive patient participation in treatment and physical rehabilitation
- Relaxation for the entire family causing meaningful time spent together in a positive, creative way



For 28 years, Friends has been delivering hope and happiness in a time of so much As 2020 continues to bring despair. unimaginable challenges for everyone, it has been vital to push our mission forward to the fullest. At the core of our mission, and one of the very first programs, is our **Educational and Motivational Assistance** Program (EdMAP) with our beloved Tom the Tutor. However, this summer we were faced with another very emotional and difficult challenge. Due to his own battle with cancer, Tom Mulvihill retired, and very soon after, passed away, surrounded by his beautiful family. Tom leaves behind an incredible legacy at Friends. His larger than life personality and way with children is irreplaceable. His incredible attitude and spirit throughout his battle to continue supporting families was inspirational. Most of all, we are in awe of the incredible bond Tom and these amazing kids formed as they motivated each other.

Tom owned and operated the Webster Groves Learning Center for over 30 years, providing on one academic one enrichment to local grade school and high school students primarily focused on





reading, writing and math. His patented educational philosophy was rooted in building confidence in his students and helping them uncover a belief in themselves, to which countless former students can attest. This experience and philosophy made for the perfect fit to work with pediatric patients who miss countless days in school due to treatment. Tom had a very special way of disguising time in the hospital, and learning, as FUN. He was such a gift to Friends and to every child he met.

Tom created EdMap to provide academic support for patients and their siblings. Making daily visits to the pediatric oncology centers at Mercy and Cardinal Glennon Hospitals, his main goal was to bring a smile to the face of kids battling this terrible disease. He not only did that; he brought a true sense of comfort and joy to kids and their families when they needed it the most. In addition to the hospital visits, he would use his office in Webster to work with kids in outpatient care, survivors of cancer, and their siblings. In 2016, he was the first and only non-Cardinal Glennon employee to earn the Ambassador Choice **Award for Exceptional Service.**

"Our Kids were in the best of hands with 'Tom the Tutor,' and we miss him dearly. He could connect with the kids to make each one feel uniquely special. The Kids loved to be with Tom and looked forward to his tutoring sessions. He had a gentle, kind way, always positive, reassuring and supportive. And at the heart of any interaction, Tom was not only tutoring but also building the self-esteem of each and every kid. FOKWC moved to a new office in 2018, which presented the opportunity for Tom to work with patients in a special room designed for his tutoring sessions. Friends was profoundly honored to designate this room to his memory. "Tom's Room" will carry on his learning legacy as we continue the EdMAP program for years to come. Additionally, Friends wished to honor his life by recognizing these dedications in his loving memory:

Established by board member Kathy Manganaro, Tom's Fund designates funding to Friends of Kids with Cancer's **Educational Programs with emphasis on** tutoring, educational supplies and scholarships.

The Friends of Kids with Cancer's Scholarship was renamed The Tom **Mulvihill Young Survivors Scholarship** Program, which celebrates pediatric cancer survivors for their bravery and perseverance.

"When Friends of Kids With Cancer "Friends" first began in 1992 our focus was solely on providing young cancer patients a diversion from all the medical treatments they were enduring. Leukemia 24-7 is a non-profit organization founded by **Todd Zick** in 2005. Todd named the organization Leukemia 24-7 because of the relentless nature of the disease, impacting its victims 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Todd passed away in 2010, but we press on in our efforts to resist leukemia, 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. We are a grassroots, all-volunteer organization focused on helping leukemia patients in three primary ways:

- ★ Our organization helps grow the national bone marrow donor registry, which gives current leukemia patients better odds for a second chance at a cancer-free life.
- ★ We help to support patients and their families; trying to make their lives a little more normal with educational, emotional and recreational support.
- ★ We strive to raise awareness and contribute resources to support the global effort to find a cure for Leukemia and all forms of cancer.



We do this by hosting family friendly events, bone marrow registry drives, and by supporting partner organizations and patients.

In 2020, L247 held 2 events to raise awareness & funds to benefit those affected by blood cancers.

- ★ Our Virtual Bandana Bash was held on September 9th. Bringing our annual outdoor festival into a virtual setting was a unique experience, which featured a live auction and live DJ.


